EQ stands for Electric Quilt - a computer software package that helps you see your quilt before you make it.

Quilting Tips

Tips from www.blockcentral.com. Enjoy

- Found a great eye-saver in hubby's shop. It is a B&D Snake light. It is long and flexible. Curls around your neck and makes a great spotlight for Redwork embroidery, etc. No need for a high powered lamp nearby and great for traveling!
- Use paper towel tubes for storing my left over pieces of bindings. It keeps then nice and flat. no need to re-iron.
- Roll your quilts on wrapping paper tubes covered with acid free tissue paper to make them safe for your quilt.
- Don't fold quilts in half and then in quarters--the dent in the middle shows quickly. Fold it in thirds horizontially and then vertically. There is less wrinkling if the pieced side is out.
- For quilt labels, set your machine to alphabet stitching and sew your name and other information right into the fabric. Quilt over the top of the lettering.
